Pits impracticable.</p> <p>Thence I run,</p> <p>N.1'W. on a true line between secs. 34 and 35.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, through dense undergrowth.</p> <p>Ascend.</p> <p>4.70 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows S.20*W., thence along spring branch.</p> <p>21.05 Leave branch from NW.</p> <p>24.14 Same branch, flows SW..</p> <p>34.00 Top of hill bears E and W and enter flat about 700 ft. above closing cor.</p> <p>37.25 Trail to Rock Creek bears E and W.</p> <p>38.00 Set a basalt stone 16 x 10 x 10 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> on W. face and raised a mound of stone 2 ft. base, <math>1\frac{1}{2}</math> ft. high W. of cor.
