CHAINS	
	At the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32. Thence I run, N.4'W between secs. 29 and 30. Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. Descend.
20.37	A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line I mark with 2 notches on N and S sides.
31.50	Channel of Rock Creek 40 lks. wide, flows SW about 175 ft. below sec. cor.
37.35	Channel of Rock Creek 50 lks. wide, flows SW.
40.00	Set a basalt stone 16 x 8 x 6 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face, from which A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.69*E., 48 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 29 B T. A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.55*W., 128 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 B T. F. J. ^{N. W.} Comins house bears W about 7 chs. dist.
41.03	Trail bears NE and SW and ascend 150 ft. to
80.00	Set a basalt stone 20 x 12 x 6 ins., 15 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, marked with 2 notches on S and 5 notches on E edges, from which A chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears N.65*E., 27 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 20 B T. A chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears S.69*E., 21 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 29 B T. A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.24*W., 30 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 31 B T. A dogwood, 10 ins. diam., bears N.59*W., 60 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 30 B T. Land mountainous. Soil clay loam, 2nd rate. Timber fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, maple and cottonwood. Undergrowth hemlock, vine maple, fir, hazel, willow, dogwood and chinquapin.
