The quality of the land in this fractional Township, is not of that grade necessary to be successfully cultivated, although there are a few small valleys of 1st grade agricultural lands. The hills generally being good stock ranges, and are sought after for that purpose. It also contains a large amount of good timber lands, principally fir, oak, cedar and laurel. There are two Salt Springs; one in Sec. 26, and the other in Sec. 25. Both of them formerly worked and considered very valuable.
