General Description.

This Township is hilly generally, and about a fourth of it, too hilly for settlement or cultivation.

There are a few small pieces of bottom land along the river, well adapted to cultivation.

The slopes of the hills facing the river are, many of them, prairie or oak openings adapted to grazing.
