Tps. 24 and 25 S., R. 7 W. N. bdy. of sec. 4.
Va 20*E.

Descend.

- .79 Closing cor. to secs. 32 and 33, which is a post marked
and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
- 12.00 Porter Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N.15*W. 200 ft. below
cor.
- 16.21 A stream, 3 lks. wide, course NW.
- 40.30 $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor, a post marked and witnessed as described
by the Surveyor General.
- 47.00 Summit of ridge bears NW and SE., 400 ft. above Porter
creek. Descend.
- 50.50 Small branch course N. 50 ft. below ridge. Ascend.
- 59.00 Summit of ridge, course N and S. 90 ft. above branch.
- 65.50 Spring branch, course N. 100 ft. below ridge.
- 77.38 Cor. of sec. 3, 4, 33 and 34. A post marked and
witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, 3rd rate.
- Timber, Fir, Hemlock and Cedar.
- Undergrowth, arrowwood, maple, salal and briars.
- Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth
- 77.38 chs. Oct. 27. At this cor, I set off 13*10'S.
on the declare and at 1*44', am, l, m,t, observe the
sun on the meridian, resulting latitude 43*26.5'
which is the latitude nearly.
