80.83

To cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 which is a post firmly set in the ground marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, and Cedar partly burnt and fallen.

Undergrowth, hazel, briars and thimble berries.

Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth
80.83 chs.

Oct. 28, 1896.

East, between secs. 1 and 36.

Va 20*35'E.

Ascend from cor.

12.00 Leave old burn and enter green timber.

19.75 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course NW.

39.43 $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. which is a fir post firmly set in the ground marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

45.00 Summit of ridge bears NE and SW., 150 ft. above the stream, thence descend.

49.50 Small branch, course SW., 100 ft. below ridge. Ascend.

79.80 Intersect E bdy. of Tp. 6 lks. S. of Whipple's cor. and 1.94 chs. N of old Tp. cor., both cors. are marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock and Cedar, partly burnt and fallen.

Undergrowth hazel, fir, salal and thimble berry.

Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth.
