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East Boundary of T. 25 S., R. 9 W.

- 40.00 Set a hemlock post 3 ft. long 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 12 on the W. and S. 7 on the E. faces from which
- A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.56*E. 30 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
- A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S.45*W. 10 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
- 41.75 Summit of mountain, divide bet. Umpqua and Coos Rivers, 1500 ft. above Bottom Creek, bears E. and W.
- Descend steep N. slope of mountain
- 62.20 Spring branch 2 lks. wide in ravine 300 ft. deep, course N.80*W.
- 78.00 Leave undergrowth, bears E. and W.
- 80.00 Set a sandstone 24x12x10 ins. 18 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12 marked with 1 notch on the N. and 5 notches on the S. edges from which
- A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.60*E. 21 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 6 B T
- A hemlock, 36 ins. diam., bears S.35 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E. 50 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 7 B T
- A hemlock, 36 ins. diam., bears S.20*W. 12 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 9 W S 12 B T
- A hemlock, 36 ins. diam., bears N.61 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W. 24 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 9 W S 1 B T
- Land mountainous
- Soil sandy, 3rd rate
- Timber fir and hemlock with some cedar
- Undergrowth vine maple, huckle berry, elk thorns and laurel
- Mountainous and heavily timbered land 80.00 chs.
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- Thence I run North bet. secs. 1 and 6
- Descend N. slope of mountain through heavy timber
- 1.50 Steeper descent
- 5.25 Dry bed of stream 30 lks. wide, water sinks just above
