## Retracement and Resurvey of Subdivisional Lines T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

lat. is 43°25' N.

42.00 Top of spur, bears E. and W. descend

43.62 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E. ascend

60.00 Top of ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend rocky ridge, (900 ft. descent)

78.30 North fork of Wolf creek, 20 lks. wide, course E.

Ascend

80.00 Set a cedar post 3 ft. long 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, marked T 25 S S 2 on NE., R 8 W S 11 on SE., S 10 on SW., and S 3 on NW. faces with 5 notches on S. and 2 notches on E. edges from which

A burnt fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.16°E. 47 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 2 B T

A burnt fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.71°E., 79 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 11 B T

A burnt fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.40°W. 39 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 10 B T

A burnt fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.65°W., 52 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 3 B T

This cor. falls on the old blazed line; blazes very faint  
No traces of old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11 (See Method of Procedure.)

Land, mountainous

Soil, 2nd and 3rd rate

Timber, burnt and fallen. Dense undergrowth, little fir, hemlock, laurel, and dead mountain balm.

Mountainous land, covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey, 80.00 chs.

June 29, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11

North, on a random line, bet. secs. 2 and 3

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. No trace of old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec cor.

84.75 Intersect the N. bdy. of the Tp. 70 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, previously described.
