

## Retracement and Resurvey of Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense underbrush and exceptionally difficult to survey  
84.75 chs.

Sky overcast at noon; observation for lat. not possible  
June 30, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16

Thence I run

South, on resurvey bet. secs. 15 and 16

Descend ridge, in heavy timber and dense undergrowth following old survey line, exceptionally difficult to survey

6.75 Trail, bears E. and W.

8.00 Branch of Wolf Creek, 10 lks. wide course E.

Ascend steep rocky ridge in dense underbrush

38.00 Top of ridge, bears E. and W. also Haines horse trail

Descend ridge in heavy timber and brush

40.00 Set a laurel post 3 ft. long 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. bet. secs. 15 and 16 marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 16 on W. and 15 on E. face from which

A fir, 16 ins. diam, bears S.7\*30'E. 54 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 15 B T

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.15\*30'W. 55 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 16 B T

This cor. falls on the old blazed line of survey. No trace of old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. (See Method of Procedure).

62.97 Cougar Creek, 10 lks. wide, course E.

Ascend steep rocky point, and enter heavy burn

80.00 Set a fir post 3 ft. long 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22 marked T 25 S S 15 on NE., R 8 W S 22 on SE., S 21 on SW., and S 16 on NW. faces with 3 notches on S. and 3 notches on E. edges; from which
