Thence I run

North, on retracement of W. Bdy. sec. 21

Ascend alongside rocky ridge, in dense growth of little
fir, hemlock and fallen timber, exceptionally difficult
to survey.

40.00 No trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

41.00 Top of main divide, bears E. and W.

Descend

Thence over level plateau in dense undergrowth

46.00 Main Ranger trail, bears E. and W.

49.00 Descend over rimrocks, 400 ft. high, bears E. and W.

72.00 Creek 2 lks. wide course N.60°E. 1200 ft. below top of
ridge

77.50 Creek 1 lk. wide, course SE.

80.26 Cor. of secs. 16 and 21 heretofore described, bears East
513 lks. dist.; therefore the true course of this line
is N.3°40'E. and the distance is 80.42 chs.

Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar
