

Extension Survey of
Subdivisional Lines of T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Descend steep slope

55.45 Small creek 1 lk. wide course SE.

Ascend 45* slope through heavy timber and dense underbrush

74.70 Top of Case-Knife ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend 45* slope through heavy timber and dense undergrowth

84.70 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 8 W., 1.69 chs.

S.89*09'W, of the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 which is a post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, and which I now change to refer to secs. 33 and 34, and cut out bearing trees to the south.

At point of intersection, I set a maple post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. for secs. 3 & 4, marked C C T 25 S R 8 W on S., S 3 on E., and S 4 on W. faces; with 3 grooves on E. and 3 grooves on W. faces; from which

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S.40*30'E. 76 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 3 B T

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.68*W. 31 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 4 B T

Land, mountainous

Soil; 1st and 2nd rate

Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, madrone and cedar

Dense underbrush of small fir, hemlock, balm and poison ivy.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey
