- 60.30 Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE.  
 Descend
- 63.30 Dry canyon, course SE.  
 Ascend
- 69.50 Top of ridge, bears E. and W.  
 Descend steep ridge
- 76.31 Creek, 3 lks. wide course E.
- 76.84 Set a fir limb post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in  
 the ground for cor. of secs. 5 and 8, marked T 25 S  
 S 8 on SW. and R 8 W S 5 on NW. faces; with 5 notches  
 on S. and 1 notch on N. edges; from which  
 A fir stub, 40 ins. diam., bears N.10\*W. 42 lks.  
 dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 5 B T  
 A fir, 80 ins. diam., bears S.20\*W. 14 lks. dist.  
 marked T 25 S R 8 W S 8 B T
- 80.00 Set fir limb post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the  
 ground for cor. of secs. 4 and 9, marked T 25 S S 4  
 on NE., and R 8 W S 9 on SE. face; with 5 notches on  
 S. and 4 notches on E. edges; from which  
 A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.66\*30'E. 200 lks. dist.  
 marked T 25 S R 8 W S 4 B T  
 A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears S.79\*30'E. 92 lks. dist.  
 marked T 25 S R 8 W S 9 B T
- Land, mountainous  
 Soil; 2nd and 3rd rate  
 Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, cedar and madrone.  
 Dense underbrush, vine maple, little fir, hemlock and  
 poison ivy.  
 Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense  
 undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey
