A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 80° W., 8 lks. dist.

marked T 25 S R 8 W S 32 B T

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 34° 40' W., 32 lks. dist.

marked T 25 S R 8 W S 29 B T

Land, mountainous

Soil; 2nd and 3rd rate

Timber, mostly heavy fir, hemlock, cedar and alder

Dense underbrush, vine maple, rhododendron, salal and small fir

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth, and exceptionally difficult to survey
