marked T 25 S R 8 W S 20 B T

A maple, 6 ins. diam., bears S.0°30'E. 9 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 8 W S 29 B T

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S.55°W. 94 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 8 W S 30 B T

A yew, 14 ins. diam., bears N.16°30'W. 20 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 8 W S 19 B T

Land, mountainous

Soil; 2nd and 3rd rate

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and madrone

Dense undergrowth of little fir, hemlock, salal and
rhododendron.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense
undergrowth, and exceptionally difficult to survey,
80.00 chs.

July 25, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30

Thence I run

East, bet. secs. 20 and 29

Ascending steep ridge, through burnt timber and dense
underbrush, exceptionally difficult to survey.

5.25 Top of main divide, 2000 ft. above sea level, bears
NE. and SW.

Descend

18.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW.

Ascend

24.00 Deserted cabin, bears N. 5 chs. dist.

26.00 Top of ridge. Trail along ridge bears N. And S.

Descend through dense timber and underbrush

32.15 Dry canyon, course SE.
