69.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW., ascend
72.70 Top of main divide, 2500 ft. above sea level, also
Ranger trail, bears N. and S.; descend
85.90 Intersect the W. bdy. of sec. 21, 3.16 chs. S.3*40'W.
from the cor. of secs. 16 and 21, previously reestab-
lished by me. At point of intersection, I set a fir
post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground
for closing cor. for secs. 17 and 20, marked C C T 25
S R 8 W on W., S 20 on S. and S 17 on N. face; with 3
grooves on N. and S. face; from which
A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.80*W. 42 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 8 W S 20 B T
A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.22*W., 13 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 8 W S 17 B T
Land, mountainous
Soil; 2nd and 3rd rate
Timber, heavy fir, hemlock and cedar.
Dense undergrowth, small fir, hemlock, vine maple and
salal.
Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense
undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey
85.90 chs.

Thence I run

8.00 Head of rocky canyon, course N.; ascend

23.30 Top of main divide, bears N. and S.; descend
25.30 Coos Bay trail, bears N. and S.
29.70 Dry canyon, course SW.; ascend
32.00 Coos Bay trail, bears SW. and NE.
