

Extension Survey of
Subdivisional Lines of T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 40.00 Set chinquapin post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 on N., and 19 on S. face; from which
- A chinquapin, 13 ins. diam., bears N.8*30'E. 49 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B T
- A chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears S.58*10'W. 18 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T
- 45.80 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.
- 48.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; ascend
- 62.80 Top of main divide, Coos Bay Trail, along top of ridge, bears SW. and NE.; descend
- 68.15 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.
- 73.00 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.; ascend
- 77.00 Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE.; descend
- 79.00 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.; ascend
- 80.00 Top of ridge, bears N. and S.; ascend
- 80.41 Intersect the E. bdy. of T. 25 S., R. 9 W., 8.68 chs. N. 0*36'W. of the cor. of secs. 13 and 24, previously described. At point of intersection, I set a yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. for secs. 18 and 19, marked C C T 25 S R 8 W on E., S 18 on N. and S. 19 on S. faces; with 3 grooves on N. and 3 grooves on S. faces; from which
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.81*30'E., 12 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 18 B T
- A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.17*30'E. 45 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 19 B T
- Land, mountainous
- Soil; 2nd and 3rd rate
- Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, poison ivy and salal
- Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth, and exceptionally difficult to survey
- 80.41 chs.
