Extension Survey of  
Subdivisional Lines of T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

August 7, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18

Thence I run

West, bet. secs. 7 and 18

Ascend steep slope, through dense timber and underbrush,  
exceptionally difficult to survey

8.00 Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE.; descend

22.80 Dry canyon, course NE., ascend

40.00 Set a rhododendron post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins.  
in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 7 on N.  
and 18 on S. faces; from whichA fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.37°E. 12 lks. dist.  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 18 B TA hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.11°W., 46 lks. dist.  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 7 B T41.00 Top of main divide, bears NW. and SE. Coos Bay trail  
along ridge; along rocky south slope

47.20 Coos Bay trail, bears NE. and SW.

70.00 Top of main divide, bears NE. and SW. Coos Bay trail,  
along ridge; descend steep slope.81.30 Intersect the E. bdy. T 25 S., R. 9 W., 12.64 chs. N.  
0°35'E. of the cor. of secs. 12 and 13, previously  
described. At point of intersection, I set a cedar  
post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground,  
for closing cor. for secs. 7 and 18, marked C C T 25  
S R 8 W on E., S 7 on N. and S 18 on S. faces; with  
4 grooves on S. and 2 grooves on N. faces; from which  
A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.43°30'E. 52 lks.  
dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 7 B T  
A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S.22°30'E. 22 lks.  
dist. marked T 25 S R 8 W S 18 B T

Land, mountainous

Soil, 2nd and 3rd rate

Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, cedar and madrone

Dense undergrowth, little fir, hemlock, rhododendron,
