on the lat. arc:  $23^{\circ}6'N$ . on the decl. arc. and deter-  
mine a true meridian with the Solar, at the closing  
cor. of T. 25 and 26 S., R. 9 W. described above.

Thence I run.

East, on a true line bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Va.  $19^{\circ}15'E$ .

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber, and dense  
undergrowth.

16.11 Set dogwood post, 3 ft. long 4 ins. sq. 24 ins., in +75

the ground for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S on N faces;  
from which,

A hemlock 10 ins., diam., bears  $S.76^{\circ}E$ . 34 lks.  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears  $N.22^{\circ}W$ ., 49 lks. dist.  
marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.

19.60 Descend, hill, bears NW and SE. -150

24.71 Spring branch 1 lk. wide, runs. SE.

30.26 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, runs SW. -40

53.60 Top of ridge bears  $N.50^{\circ}W$ . and  $S. 50^{\circ}E$ . +35056.11 Set maple post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the  
ground for cor. of Secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, marked,

T 25 S S 32 on NE

R 9 W S 5 on SE

T 26 S S 6 on SW and S 31 on NW faces, with 5  
notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edges,
