Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 9 W

CHAINS

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.48-3/4*E., 47 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 26 B T.

A fir, 28, ins. diam., bears S.76 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 52 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 9 W S 35 B T.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.75*W., 9 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 34 B T.

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N.30 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 42 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 27 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly; 2nd. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock and maple.

Undergrowth, laurel and huckle berry.

Mountainous and heavily timbered lands, 80.00 chs.

East, on a random line bet. secs. 26 and 35.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.10 Intersect N. and S. line, 5 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36.

Thence I run S.89*58'W. on a true line bet. secs. 26 & 35.

Ascend E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.10 Top of ridge point, 25 ft. above sec. cor., bears N.10*W. and S.10*E.

Descend W. slope.

12.25 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide in ravine 300 ft. deep, course N.

Ascend E. slope.

27.60 Ridge point, 300 ft. high, bears N. and S.

Descend.

33.51 A fir 40 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.

33.75 Ravine, 300 ft. deep, course N.15*W.

Ascend over rolling ground.
