	Undergrowth, huckle berry, laurel and vine maple. Mountainous and heavily timbered lands, 80.00 chs.
	N.89°58'E. on a random line bet. secs. 23 and 26.
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.cor.
80.00	Intersect N. and S. line, 28 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.
	Thence I run N.89°50'W on a true line bet. secs. 23 & 26. Descend W. slope through heavy timber and scattering under- growth.
6.50	Creek, in canyon 200 ft. deep, 5 lks. wide, course S.60°W.
21.00	Same creek, course N.70°W. Descend over ridges and ravines along N. slope of mount- ain.
29.71	A fir, 24 ins. diam., I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
40.00	Set a sandstone, 28x12x12 ins., 21 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face; from which, A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N.50°E., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T. A hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears S.45°W., 14 lks. Dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S.26, B T.
50.75	More gradual descent into N. Fork Bottom Creek.
65.00	Foot of descent, 500 ft. below sec. cor., bears NE. & SW. Over bottom.
66.25	N. Fork Bottom Creek, 20 lks. wide, sandy bottom, swift current, course S.60°W. Over bottom land.
67.70	Ascend E. slope of mountain.
76.50	More gradual ascent.
80.00	The cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27. Land, level and mountainous. Soil, rich loam and sandy, 1st. and 2nd. rate. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and maple, with some alder.
