

Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 9 W., W. M.,

CHAINS

Undergrowth, huckleberry, sallow and laurel.
 Mountainous and heavily timbered lands, 80.00 chs.
 Overcast at noon prevented taking the latitude.
 October 22, 1902

N.0*02'W. bet. secs. 22 and 23.

Over gently rolling ground, through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.

- 16.50 Ravine, 75 ft. deep, course E.
- 22.50 A fir, 36 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
- 24.95 Creek, 5 lks. wide, in ravine, 200 ft. deep, course E. Ascend steep S. slope.
- 35.75 Ridge point, 200 ft. above creek, bears NW., SE. Descend.
- 40.00 Marked a fir, 10 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 22 on the W. and S. 23 on the E. from which,
 A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.45*E., 44 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
 A cedar, 40 ins. diam., bears W. 21 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 40.50 Ravine, 100 ft. deep course E.
- 60.75 Creek, 5 lks. wide, in ravine, 150 ft. deep, course E. Ascend.
- 65.25 More gradual ascent.
- 70.00 Descend over nearly level ground.
- 80.00 Set a sandstone 28x15x12 ins., 21 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, marked with 3 notches on the S. and 2 notches on the E. edges; from which,
 A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.58*E., 28 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 9 W S 14 B T.
 A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S.65*E., 8 lks. dist., marked T.25 S R 9 W S 23 B T.
 A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.48*W., 31 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 22 B T.
