Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 9 W. W. M.,

CHAINS

42.25 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in canyon, 300 ft. deep,
course E.

Ascend S. slope of Mountain.

68.10 Perpendicular Bluffs, 75 ft. high, bears E. and W.

73.00 Ridge point, 350 ft. above creek, bears NE and SW.

Descend gradually.

80.00 Set fir post, 4 ins. sq., 3 ft. long., 24 ins. in the
ground, for cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, marked
T 25 S S 11 on NE., R 9 W S 14 on SE., S 15 on SW.,
and S 10 on the NW. faces, with 4 notches on the S.
and 2 notches on the E. edges; from which,

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.10°E., 161 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 9 W S 11 B T.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.15°E., 166 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 9 W S 14 B T.

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.55°W., 71 lks. dist.,
marked T 25 S R 9 W S 15 B T.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.80°W., 57 lks. dist.
marked T 25 S R 9 W S 10 B T.

Land, rolling and mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam and gravelly, 1st. and 3rd. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple and matherone.

Undergrowth, huckleberry, laurel and sallal.

Mountainous and heavily timbered land, 80.00 chs.

Overcast at noon prevented taking the latitude.

October 23, 1902

At the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

Thence I run S.89°52'E. on a random line bet. secs. 11
and 14.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.80 Intersect N. and S. line 26 lks. S. of the cor. of secs.
11, 12, 13 and 14.

Thence I run S.89°57'W. on a true line bet secs. 11 & 14.

Descend into canyon through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.
