Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 9 W., W. M.,

CHAINS

- 21.50 Ridge point, bears NW. and SE.
- 25.25 Creek, 6 lks. wide, in ravine, 200 ft. deep, course S.60*E.
Ascend steep S. slope of mountain.
- 40.00 Marked a fir, 18 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 28 on the W and S. 27 on the E. faces; from which,
A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.3- $\frac{3}{4}$ *E. 43 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.15*W., 29 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 51.00 Ridge point, 500 ft. above Bottom Creek bears E. and W.
Descend over ridges and ravines.
- 80.00 Set a sand stone, 18x10x5 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27, 28, marked with 2 notches on the S. and 4 notches on E. edges; from which,
A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.22*E., 51 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 22 B T.
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.21*E., 38 lks dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 27 B T.
A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.8*W., 78 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W S 28 B T.
A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.18*W., 21 lks dist., marked T 25 S R 9 W. S 21 B T.

Land, level and mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam and gravelly; 1st. and 3rd. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple and myrtle.

Undergrowth, laurel, sallah, salmon berry and huckleberry.

Mountainous and heavily timbered lands 80.00 chs.
