CHAINS

General Description

These two townships are entirely mountainous. The first two miles of this line lie on a plateau with long slopes and covered with a first rate growth of timber, principally fir, but with considerable cedar, hemlock and yew.

The next two miles are on broken and precipitous ground sparsely timbered.

The line crosses the North Umpqua river at a little over a mile north of the corner of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12.

The line North of the river ascends quite abruptly through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

The irregularity in the length of these Tps. is a little over half a mile in excess of the regular distance.

Retracements and Resurvey of the North, South, and West Boundary of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M., as Surveyed by Fred Mensch, Deputy Surveyor, under contract #797, dated April 19, 1910.

Retracement of North Boundary of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

At the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on S boundary of T. 25 S., R. 1 W.

This cor. is partially obliterated, no trace being found of the cor. or the NW bearing tree. The other bearing trees and the bearing rock are found.

I re-establish the cor. in its original position as the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 25 S., R. 1 W., only as follows:

Point for cor. of secs. 35 and 36 falls on a basalt rock in place, 18 x 12 x 6 ins., above ground, on which I cut a cross (x) at exact corner point, with 1 notch E and 5 notches W of cross, from which
