

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Retracement and Resurvey of West Boundary of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

Land mountainous.

Soil, stony, 4th rate.

Timber fir, hemlock; undergrowth vine maple, chinquapin and fir.

Retracement

From the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, T. 25 S., R. 2 W., I run, South on E boundary of sec. 12, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

Descend S slope.

The 1/4 sec. cor. bears E. 72 lks. dist. No trace is found of the post but both bearing trees are standing and plainly marked.

I re-establish the cor. in its original position as the 1/4 sec. cor. on E boundary of sec. 12, T. 26 S., R. 2 W., only as follows:

Set a basalt stone 18 x 12 x 10 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor. on E boundary of sec. 12, T. 26 S., R. 2 W., marked 1/4 on W face, from which

A fir, 70 ins. diam., bears S.21*W., 40 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 12 B T.

A cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears N.77*W., 27 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 12 B T.

I obliterate marks on former bearing tree referring to sec. 7.

The course of this line is S.1*E., and the distance is 40.93 chs.

July 27, 1910.

At the 1/4 sec. cor. on E boundary of sec. 12, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

Thence I run,

South on E boundary of Sec. 12, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

Descend SE slope.
