Resurvey of West Boundary of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

73.00 Ridge point descending E.

87.60 Point for cor. of secs. 24 and 25, T. 26 S., R. 2 W., falls on a basalt rock in place, 6 x 12 x 12 ins., above ground on which I cut a cross (x) at exact cor. point, with 4 notches N and 2 notches S of cross, from which

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.18*W., 49 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 2 W S 25 B T.

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.38*W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 2 W S 24 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil, stony, 4th rate.

Timber, fir and cedar.

Undergrowth vine maple and hemlock.

N.1*20'W on a true line on E boundary of secs. 24, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

Gradually descend NE slope.

12.30 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

43.25 Edge of bluff 100 ft. high, point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. will fall on bluff.

A basalt rock 8 x 8 x 12 ft. for witness cor. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on E boundary of sec. 24, T. 26 S., R. 2 W., I mark with a cross (x) at exact cor. point, W C $\frac{1}{4}$ W of cross, from which

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.13*W., 14 lks. dist., marked W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 B T.
