

## Subdivisions of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.32 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 16 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 24 B T.

A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears S.27\*E., 3 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 25 B T.

Face of perpendicular rock, bears S.54\*W., 18 lks. dist., marked with a cross (x) at exact bearing point, B O 26.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.18\*W., 29 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 23 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil loam and stony, 2nd and 4th rate..

Timber fir, and hemlock; undergrowth rhododendron, vine maple and lilac.

August 7, 1910.

At the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.

I find it impossible to run East from this cor. on account of bluffs and precipices. I return to the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30 on E boundary of the Tp. previously described.

Thence I run

N.89\*57'W between secs. 24 and 25.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

10.00 Begin descent of W slope.

20.16 To precipitous ground. Impossible to continue the line further.

I mark WC  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 24 on N and 25 on S side, from which

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N.10\*E., 10 lks. dist., marked W C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 24 B T.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S.29\*W., 10 lks. dist., marked W C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 25 B T.

Land mountainous.
