## Subdivisions of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS	<p>Ascend S slope.</p> <p>45.00 U. S. Forest Trail bears E and W.</p> <p>80.00 Set a conglomerate stone 18 x 12 x 8 ins., 6 ins. in the ground (solid bedrock prevents setting deeper) in mound of stone, for cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, marked with 5 notches on S and 3 notches on E edge, from which.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.22*E., 131 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 3 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.49*E., 69 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 10 B T.</p> <p>No trees within limits in secs. 4 and 9. Raise a mound of stone 2½ ft. base, 1½ fr. high, W of cor.</p> <p>Pits impracticable.</p> <p>Land mountainous.</p> <p>Soil stony, 4th rate.</p> <p>Timber fir and hemlock; undergrowth vine maple and hemlock.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">August 29, 1910.</p>
40.00	<p>At the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>S.89*55'E on a random line between secs. 3 and 10.</p> <p>Set temp. ¼ sec. cor.</p>
80.20	<p>Intersect N and S line 38 lks. N of the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>N.89*39'W on a true line between secs. 3 and 10.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.</p>
5.40	<p>Ascend E slope.</p> <p>Trail on ridge bears N and S.</p> <p>Descend W slope.</p>
