

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivisions of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

A fir, 12 ins. diam., for closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4,  
I mark CC T 26 S R 1 W on S, S 3 on E and S 4 on W side,  
with 3 notches on E and W sides, from which

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.25°E., 36 lks. dist.,  
marked T 26 S R 1 W S 3 B T.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.71°W., 18 lks. dist.,  
marked T 26 S R 1 W S 4 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil stony, 4th rate.

Timber fir; undergrowth fir and arrowwood.

The length of the N boundary of sec. 3 is 80.63 chs.

Therefore at point midway on this line, 22.96 $\frac{1}{2}$  chs.

N.89°23'E., of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on S boundary of sec. 33,  
T. 25 S., R. 1 W., I establish  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on N boundary  
of sec. 3, as follows:

Set a basalt stone 18 x 10 x 6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground  
for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on N boundary of sec. 3, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on S  
face, from which

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears S.6°E., 28 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 3 B T.

A dogwood, 10 ins. diam., bears S.41°W., 5 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 3 B T.

August 30, 1910.

At the cor. of secs. 32 and 33 on the S boundary of the  
Tp. previously described.

Thence I run

N.0°3'W between secs. 32 and 33.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with  
dense undergrowth.

Ascend S slope.
