CHAINS	Ascend NE slope.
48.85	Ridge bears N and S. Descend NW slope.
51.50	Bluff 15 ft. high.
63.20	Bluff 40 ft. high
64.85	North Umpqua river, 2.50 chs. wide, course SW.
69.85	U. S. Forest trail bears NE and SW.
80.12	The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17. Land mountainous. Soil stony, 4th rate. Timber fir and hemlock; undergrowth arrowwood, lilsac and hemlock.

	At the cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17. Thence I run N.0*3'W between secs. 8 and 9. Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth. Ascend S slope.
31.60	Trail bears E and W.
40.00	Set a conglomerate stone 12 x 8 x 6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face, from which A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.69*E., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T. A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.41*W., 50 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T.
44.85	A fir, 5 ft. diam., marked with 2 notches on N and S sides.
53.00	Bluff 30 ft. high.
57.00	Ridge bears NW and SE. Along E slope.
