

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivisions of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

West on a true line between secs. 29 and 32.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

Along N slope.

25.00 Divide between North Umpqua river and Emile creek bears NW and SE.

Descend SW slope.

37.50 Top of bluff 100 ft. high bears NW and SE.

39.95 Point for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on bluff.

40.60 Foot of bluff. On perpendicular face of bluff 3 ft.

above ground, for witness cor. to be  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., ICut a cross (x) at exact cor. point, WC  $\frac{1}{4}$  N of cross,

from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.85\*W., 17 lks. dist.,

marked W C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 29 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.80\*W., 24 lks. dist.,

marked W C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 32 B T.

49.50 Ravine, course S.

Ascend SE slope.

64.25 Ravine, course SE.

70.00 Ridge point descending S.

Descend SW slope.

79.90 The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Land mountainous.

Soil stony, 4th rate.

Timber fir; undergrowth vine maple and manzanita.

September 9, 1910.

At the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Thence I run

West between secs. 30 and 31.

Over mountainous land, sparsely timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.
