

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivisions of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

CHAINS

Point for closing cor. of secs. 7 and 18 falls on a conglomerate rock in place, 4 x 10 x 12 ins., above ground on which I cut a cross (x) at exact cor. point, marked CC on E with 2 grooves N and 4 grooves S of cross, from which

A maple, 5 ins. diam., bears N.36*E., 26 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 7 B T.

A maple, 5 ins. diam., bears S.41½*E., 15 lks. dist., marked T 26 S R 1 W S 18 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil stony, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber fir; undergrowth vine maple and hemlock.

The W boundary of sec. 18 is 80.10 chs. Therefore at point midway on this line, 4.73 chs. S.0*47'W of the ¼ sec. cor. on E boundary of sec. 13, T. 26 S., R. 2 W., I establish ¼ sec. cor. on W boundary of sec. 18, as follows:

Set a basalt stone 15 x 10 x 8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. on W boundary of sec. 18, marked ¼ on E face, from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.37*E., 31 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 18 B T.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.57*E., 52 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 18 B T.

I return to the cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18.

Thence I run

N.0*4'W between secs. 7 and 8.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

Ascend S slope.
