CHAINS	
	I return to the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, heretofore described.
	Thence N.0*21'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 29 and 30. Over mountainous land.
	Ascend steep rocky S slope, through dense undergrowth.
6.70	Ascend bluff, 40 ft. high, bears E and W.
16.75	Top of high ridge, divide bet. Emile Creek and North Umpqua River, bears E and W; enter heavy timber, bears E and W; descend steep rocky N slope.
35.00	Foot of steep descent; gradually descend NW slope.
40.01	Intersect the 1/4 sec. cor., which is a conglomerate stone, 6x12x4 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
	Thence N.0*19'W., continuing the measurement.
66.50	Spur, slopes NW; descend steep NE slope.
68.35	Trail, bears E and W.
79.80	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NW.
79.89	Intersect the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, which is a point on basalt boulder, 3x2x2 ft., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
	Land mountainous.
	Soil, rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
	Timber fir, hemlock and cedar.
	Undergrowth, snowbrush, manzanita, lilac, hazel, rhododendron and hemlock.
	West, on a true line, bet. secs. 19 and 30.
	Over mountainous land, through dense timber and undergrowth.
0.10	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NW; ascend steep NE slope.
9.75	Spur, slopes N; descend steep NW slope.
18.50	Foot of steep slope; continue descent.
21.15	Trail, bears NE and SW.
23.00	A cabin bears S, 25 lks. dist.
