6.65	<p>Set granite stone, 6x10x14 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> on W face, and raise mound of stone, 2 ft. base, <math>1\frac{1}{2}</math> ft. high, west of cor., from which</p> <p>A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.42*W., 35 lks. dist.</p> <p>Marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 21 B T</p>
