81.33	Intersect 15 lks. N of cor. secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30 Thence I run N.89*39'E. on true line bet. secs. 19 and 30, descend E slope, through dense underbrush and heavy timber
12.00	Descend NE slope
41.33	Set granite stone, 6x9x14 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, from which A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S.63*W., 16 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 B T A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N.40*E., 11 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T
45.00	House, W. M. Curtiss, bears S., 19 chs. dist.
48.00	Trail and top of ridge, bears NE and SW, descend SE slope
65.40	House, Carl Luhman, bears S. 29 chs. dist.
81.33	Cor. secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30 Land, mountainous Soil, rocky, 4th rate Timber, cedar, fir, hemlock and yellow pine Underbrush, rhododendrons, vine-maple and young firs Land, mountainous, covered with dense underbrush and heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey 81.33 chs.
46.95	Thence I run N.4*W. on random line bet. secs. 19 and 20 Set temp. stake <p style="text-align: right;">August 29, 1909.</p>
	July 3, 1910: At 7 a. m. 1. m. t. set off 23*02'N. on decl. arc and 43*17' on lat. arc and determine a true meridian with solar at cor. secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30 on W bdy. of Tp. which is a stake greatly decayed, marked as described by the Surveyor General
