

Retracement-Reestablishment
Portion of S. Bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S.75*W., 57 lks. dist.
Marked T 27 S R 2 W S 3 B T (Original bearing tree)
A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.68*W., 55 lks. dist.
Marked T 26 S R 2 W S 34 B T (Original bearing tree)

Elevation at this cor. 3000 ft.

The true course and distance of this line is N.89*49'E.,
39.87 chs.

Land, mountainous

Soil, rather stony; 2nd and 3rd rate

Timber, fir and cedar

Undergrowth, dense fir, laurel, cedar, briars and sallow

October 28, 1913.

Retracement & Reestablishment of E. Boundary of secs. 1,
12 and 13. T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

December 17, 1913: I commence at the cor. of secs. 13
and 24, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., which is a stone,
firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the sur-
veyor general, and, the sky being overcast, I take a back
sight on the E. bdy. of sec. 24, which bears N.1*20'W.
and deflect an angle of 2*07' to the right, and run
N.0*47'E., retracing the E. bdy. of sec. 13.

Ascend steep slope through heavy timber and dense under-
growth.

- 3.00 Top of steep ascent, over bench land with gradual S. slope
- 6.50 Trail, bears NE and SW. Elevation 1480 ft.
- 25.63 Enter swamp, bears E and W.
- 29.88 Leave swamp, bears NE and SW
- Forest Ranger's house bears S.62*30'E., about 10.00 chs.
dist.
- Forest Ranger's barn bears S.67'E., about 10.00 chs.
dist.
- 35.37 Old trail, bears NE and SW
- 35.60 The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 18, T. 26 S., R. 1 W., which is a
basalt stone, firmly set, marked and witnessed as de-
scribed by the surveyor general, bears West, 5 lks. dist.
