	<p>The true course and distance of this line from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. is N.89°16'W., 39.22 chs.</p> <p>Land, mountainous</p> <p>Soil, good clayey loam; 3rd rate</p> <p>Timber, fir, sugar pine and cedar</p> <p>Undergrowth, dense fir and greasewood</p> <p>Elevation 3040 ft.</p>
	<p>From the cor. of secs. 1 and 2, I run N.89°47'W., retracing the N. line of sec. 2.</p> <p>Ascending steep slope through dense brush; across old burn.</p>
1.48	Searched for closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 25 S., R. 2 W., but could find no trace of it.
8.69	Top of ridge, bears N and S.
	Descend steep slope.
11.75	Stream, 6 lks. wide, course SE; ascend steep slope
17.00	Top of ascent; along S slope
19.80	Ascend
40.00	Searched diligently, but could find none of the markings of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 2
43.41	Stream, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; continue ascent.
56.49	Trail, bears N. and S., on top of a high ridge dividing drainage of Susan Creek from that of Honey Creek.
	Elevation 3790 ft.
	Soper's Point is about 8.00 chs. S., where this ridge drops down to a low saddle.
58.78	Brink of bluffs facing W.; descend
63.00	Foot of bluffs.
	Continue descent through openings resulting from frequent fires.
80.00	Search diligently, but find no trace of sec. cor. markings.
	Set temp. cor. for secs. 2 and 3.
