

## Retracement-Reestablishment of N. Bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous

Soil, stony; 3rd rate

Timber, the old growth has been deadened by fires.

Undergrowth, dense greasewood, chinquapin and fir brush on the old burn; on the last 17.00 chs. this has again been largely removed by fire, giving place to grass and fern.

December 20, 1913.

Run transit line from temp. cor. of secs. 2 and 3 N.89°47'W. on N. bdy. of sec. 3.

In burned country across basin of Honey Creek.

1.36 Stream, 2 lks. wide, course S. and turning to W. below line. Elevation 3100 ft.

3.13 Search diligently for traces of closing cor. of secs. 34 and 35, but find none.

Begin gradual descent on SW slope

17.19 Trail, bears NW and SE

19.17 Stream, 3 lks. wide, course SW. Elevation 2980 ft.

28.80 Spring, course SE

40.00 Search for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., but find no trace of it.

Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. Elevation 3050 ft.

Continue gradual descent.

49.82 Leave burn; enter heavy fir timber.

53.62 Stream, 4 lks. wide, course SW., in canyon.

Ascend steep slope

58.38 Re-enter burned country

66.00 Top of steep ascent; ascend gradually on rolling S. slope

80.00 Search for cor. of secs. 3 and 4, but find no trace of the markings.

Set temp. cor. for secs. 3 and 4

Land, high hilly basin of Honey Creek with general S. slope

Soil, sandy and clayey loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, old growth has been killed by old burn, stubs still standing; recent fires have killed smaller growth.
