

Retracement-Reestablishment of N. Bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

From temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on N. line of sec. 3, I set off
2.31 chs. S.89*47'E. and 24 lks. N. and

Set a basalt stone; 16x10x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground,
for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on N. line of sec. 3, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on S.
face, from which

A chinquapin, 4 ins. diam., bears S.9*E., 98 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B T

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears S.9*30'W., 38 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B T

From temp. cor. of secs. 3 and 4 on N. bdy. of Tp., I
set off 3.08 chs. S.89*47'E. and 32 lks. N. and

Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the
ground, for cor. of secs. 3 and 4, marked T 26 S S 3 on
SE. and R 2 W S 4 on SW. face, with 3 notches on E. and
W. edges; from which

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.12*E., 5.12 chs. dist.

Marked T 26 S R 2 W S 3 B T

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.22*W., 399 lks. dist.

Marked T 26 S R 2 W S 4 B T

Notes of original cor. here and of closing cor. near here
are probably in error when they call for mound of stone,
as there are no stones on this plateau.

From the cor. of secs. 4 and 5, I run

N.89*47'W., retracing the N. bdy. of sec. 5.

Along N. slope through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 2.25 Ravine, course NE.; ascend steep slope.
- 6.00 Searched for closing cor. of secs. 32 and 33, but could
find no trace of same.
- 7.98 Top of steep ascent; thence along N. slope
- 20.00 Begin steep ascent on NE. slope
- 23.28 Basalt bluffs, 50 ft. high, facing NE.
- 28.26 Top of ridge, known as Chimney Rocks, rising to NW.
Elevation 3090 ft.
