<p>CHAINS 29.00</p>	<p>Descend steep rocky SW. slope through old burn with dense undergrowth of manzanita and greasewood.</p>
<p>32.31</p>	<p>December 22:</p>
<p>40.00</p>	<p>Search for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., could find no trace. Set temp. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. Elevation 2800 ft.</p>
	<p>December 22, 1913.</p>
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	<p>Continue steep descent through dense brush.</p>
<p>61.74</p>	<p>Pass south side of basalt cliffs, 50 ft. high, facing S. and W. Enter live timber and leave thicket.</p>
<p>64.60</p>	<p>Stream, 6 lks. wide, course NW. Elevation 1980 ft. Ascend steep NE. slope</p>
<p>70.49</p>	<p>Top of steep ascent. Thence along steep irregular N. slope</p>
<p>80.00</p>	<p>Search for cor. of secs. 5 and 6, but find no trace Set temp. cor. of secs. 5 and 6. Elevation 2220 ft. Land, mountainous and steep Soil, clayey loam; some places very stony; 3rd rate Timber, fir, cedar and sugar pine, a fair stand in most parts. Undergrowth, dense fir, chinquapin, greasewood and rhododendron.</p>
	<p>From temp. cor. of sec. 5 and 6, I run N.89°47'W., retracing N. bdy. of sec. 6 Ascend steep NE slope</p>
<p>11.36</p>	<p>Top of broad ridge, bears W and SE.; thence along same, ascending slightly.</p>
<p>16.72</p>	<p>Ridge turns off, ascending to NW. Elevation 2500 ft.</p>
