

## Retracement-Reestablishment of N. Bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS	
	Descend gently on SW slope, through fern openings, across old burn.
30.00	Foot of descent; thence ascend gradual SE slope
40.00	Searched for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., but find no trace. Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Elevation 2460 ft.
	Descend gradually on SW. slope through heavy timber.
55.00	Cross ridge sloping to SW. and continue descent on NW. slope.
65.00	Begin very steep descent.
78.20	Intersect the range line 2.39 chs. N. of cor. of Tps. 25 and 26 S., Rs. 2 and 3 W., heretofore described. Elevation 1630 ft. Land, mountainous Soil, good clay loam, some stony spots; 2nd and 3rd rate. Timber, fir, cedar and sugar pine, a fair stand. Undergrowth, fir, cedar, chinquapin and rhododendron.  December 23, 1913.
	April 11, 1914: To re-establish corners on N. line of secs. 5 and 6, which on further careful search prove to be entirely lost, I run from cor. of Tps. 25 and 26 S., Rs. 2 and 3 W. N.89*21'E., on true N. bdy. of sec. 6.
38.30 $\frac{1}{2}$	Apportioned distance Set a cedar post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 on S. face, from which A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.31*E., 39 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.54*W., 36 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T
