

Retracement of Portion of S. and W. Bdrs. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

I commence at the cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 S., R. 2 W., on W bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 1 W.

Thence West, retracing S. bdy. of sec. 36, at 40.09 chs.

$\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. bears S., 190 lks. dist. and at 79.96 chs.

fall 288 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36.

West, retracing S. bdy. of sec. 35, at 39.82 chs. the  $\frac{1}{2}$

sec. cor. bears South, 113 lks. dist., and at 79.80 chs.

fall 208 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35.

I commence at the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, on W.

bdy. of the Tp., thence North, retracing W. bdy. of sec.

19; at 38.66 chs. the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. bears West, 23 lks.

dist. and at 79.72 chs. fall 35 lks. E. of the cor. of

secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24.

Note:

These retracements are made to locate corners from which the survey of subdivisional lines is to be initiated and also to account for discrepancies in closing, developed in the survey and resurvey of subdivisional lines in this Tp.

I return to the cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 S., R. 2 W., on W.

Bdy. of T. 26 S., R. 1 W., established by Deputy Flint

in 1882 and re-established by Deputy Angel in 1902, here-

tofore described in Book "J".

Latitude 43°15'N., longitude 122°52'W., mean mag. decl.

20°30'E.

Thence

S.87°17'W., on a true line, on S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, through dense timber and undergrowth. Along broken S. slope.

13.35 Bend in Emile Creek, 20 lks. wide, from SE., course SW.,

bears S, 10 lks. dist.
