

Retracement of Portions of S. and W. Edrs. of T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

64.25 High ridge, bears NW and SE, descend steep NE slope

79.72 Intersect the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, reestablished by Deputy Gibb in 1910 and described by him as the original cor. established by Deputy Flint in 1855 which is a granite stone, 5x10x7 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

I also find evidence of Flint's original cor., the stump of his NW bearing tree, which does not closely correspond to the present position, but I presume Deputy Gibb had other evidence of the original cor. at the time of reestablishment.

Land, mountainous

Soil, stony clay loam, 3rd rate

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and madrona

Undergrowth, snowbrush, madrona, hazel and manzanita

Retracement of Subdivisional lines, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.

I commence at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on S. bdy. of the Tp.; thence N. 20° 50' W., retracing the line bet. secs. 35 and 36; at 25.42 chs. fall 2.58 chs. W. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

I commence new line and measurement at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.; thence North, retracing line bet. secs. 35 and 36; at 33.70 chs. fall 25 lks. W. of cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36.

East, retracing the line bet. secs. 25 and 36; at 41.79 chs. the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears North, 72 lks. dist., and at 84.33 chs. fall 1.35 chs. S. of the cor. of secs. 25 and 36, on E. bdy. of the Tp.

I return to the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36; thence North, retracing the line bet. secs. 25 and 26; at 43.17 chs. the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears West, 32 lks. dist., and at 87.27 chs. fall 20 lks. E. of cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26.

East, retracing line bet. secs. 24 and 25; at 42.29 chs. the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears South, 97 lks. dist., and at 84.23 chs. fall 1.63 chs. N. of the cor. of secs. 24 and 25, on E. bdy. of the Tp.

I return to the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26; thence North retracing line bet. secs. 23 and 24; at 42.90 chs.
