CHAINS

Cor. established by Deputy Gibb as cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28 bears N.48°08'E., 10.34 chs. dist.

I destroy the cor. established by me in 1916 as SW cor. of sec. 22; also marks on bearing tree.

Land, mountainous

Soil, to 7.00 chs., rocky, 4th rate; next 8.00 chs., sandy loam, 1st rate; remainder, stony clay loam, 3rd rate

Timber, fir, sugar pine, cedar and hemlock

Undergrowth, chinquapin, rhododendron, hazel, vine maple
fir and hemlock

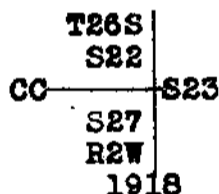
East, on a random line, for distance only, on S bdy. of sec. 22

Intersect W bdy. of sec. 23, 8.99 chs. N.1°12'E. of cor. of sec. 22, 23, 26 and 27, which I change to refer to secs. 23 and 26 only

At the point of intersection

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 22 and 27, with brass cap marked



from which

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.49°W., 54 lks. dist.

Marked C C T 26 S R 2 W S 27 B T

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.20°W., 16 lks. dist.

Marked C C T 26 S R 2 W S 22 B T

Thence

West, on a true line, on S bdy. of sec. 22

Along N slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth

Top of spur, slopes N; descend NW slope

Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N; ascend NE slope
