	N.0°16'E., on a true line, bet. secs. 27 and 28												
	Over mountainous land, through dense timber and undergrowth												
	Descend NW slope												
27.00	Patras' house bears East, 1.00 ch. dist.												
29.00	Begin descent of steep N slope												
31.00	Ward's house bears West, 7.00 chs. dist.												
39.90	Intersect the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., established by Deputy Gibb in 1909, which is a granite stone, 5x10x10 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.												
	I destroy the cors. set in the rejected revision survey, as $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cors. on W bdy. of sec. 27 and E. bdy. of sec. 28 respectively, and marks on bearing trees.												
	Thence												
	N.0°30'E., continuing the measurement												
	Descend steep N slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth												
41.25	Trail, bears NE and SW												
47.75	Trail at foot of steep slope, bears E and W; thence across bench land, nearly level												
63.94	Intersect the closing cor. of secs. 27, 28, established by me in 1916, which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 12 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I now destroy this cor.												
	Descend steep N slope												
72.73	Intersect new S bdy. of sec. 22, 7.62 chs. E of the SW cor.												
	At the point of intersection.												
	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 27 and 28, with brass cap marked.
