A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.60*W., 34 lks. dist.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 34 lks. dist.

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears, N.60*W., 10 lks. dist.

Land, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Laurel, and Maple.

Underbrush, Laurel, Hazel, Salal etc.

East on random, bet. secs. 9 and 16.

Va. 19 $\frac{1}{8}$ *E.

10.00 Summit of coast range of mountains.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post.

57.75 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course North.

79.50 Intersect line, 8 lks. north from cor. to secs. 9, 10, 15. and 16. Old post standing, and witness trees found. Thence, I ran, N.89*57'W. on true line between secs. 9 and 16.

39.75 Set a laurel post for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., from which,

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 57 lks. dist.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.30*W., 70 lks. dist.

79.50 To corner of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
