From the corner to Tps. 26 and 27 South, Rs. 8 and 9 West, I ran North on a random line bet. said ranges with a Va. 19° E. I set temp. half mile and mile cors. at each 40 and 80 chs. and find the Tp. line to be 6 miles, 1 ch. and 30 lks. long; and the falling to be 30 lks. East of the Cor. to Tps. 25 and 26 S., Rs. 8 and 9 W. The correction of the true line will therefore be 5 lks. W. per mile and its course will be
