CHAINS

- 80.00 The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, 2nd rate.  
Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, and cedar.  
Undergrowth, mountain myrtle, arrow-wood, and hazel.  
Mountainous land or land covered with dense undergrowth.  
80.00 chains.  
Sept. 19, at 5h. 15m. P.M. l.m.t. I set off  $43^{\circ}19'N$ . on the lat. arc. and  $1^{\circ}2'$  on the decl. arc. and determine a true Meridian at the cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14.  
Sept. 19, 1896.
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- From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35 in S. bdy. of Tp. 26 S R 8 W. Lat.  $43^{\circ}15'$ . Long.  $123^{\circ}37'W$ . (Supplied) which is a post marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I run  
 $N.0^{\circ}02'W$ . bet. secs. 34 and 35.  $Va.20^{\circ}15'E$ .  
Ascend from cor..
- 15.00 Summit of ridge, 70 ft. above cor.; thence descend.
- 32.50 Spring branch, course NW. 150 ft. below summit; thence ascend.
- 40.00 Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on W. face, from which  
A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears  $N.22^{\circ}E$ ., 220 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.  
A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears  $N.55^{\circ}W$ ., 240 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 43.50 A creek, 4 lks. wide, course W.
- 47.00 A branch, course SW.
- 76.50 Callahans trail, course E. and W. on summit, 30 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 80.00 Set a yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., with charred stake, 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35, marked T 26 S  $\S$  26 on NE, R 8 W  $\overset{35}{S}$  on SE,
