 70.00 A fir, 36 ins. diam. on line, marked with 2 notches on E and W sides.

 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, 2nd rate, loamy.
 Timber, fir, hemlock, and cedar, of second growth, good quality.
 Undergrowth, laurel and hemlock.
 Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth
