

## Subdivisions, of T. 26 S., R 8 W.

CHAINS

- 5.00 A fir, 40 ins. diam. on line. I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 33.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above cor. bears N. and S. Descend.
- 40.18 Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. on N. face, from which
- A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.6\*W., 148 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- A willow, 5 ins. diam., bears S.76 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 165 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 66.50 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course NE.
- 69.00 A stream, 6 lks. wide, course E.  
Thence along creek, down stream.
- 75.50 Leave creek, course S.E.
- 80.18 The cor. to secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, 400 ft. below summit.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, 4th rate.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, and cedar, nearly all dead except 5 chs. E. from Tp. line.  
Undergrowth of balm, laurel, briars, chinquapin, willow, and vinemaple.  
Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth, for 80.18 chs.
- Oct. 15, 1896.
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- Sky overcast with smoke clouds during the day. No solar observation or lat. taken Oct.15, 1896.
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- N.0\*4'W. bet. secs. 19 and 20.  
Va.20\*15'E.
- Ascend steep ridge.
- 15.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above cor. bears E. and W.
